SUBJECT: ESP IN TWINS SURVEY  
RESEARCHER: National Organization of Mothers of Twins Clubs, Inc.  
DATE: 1992 - 1992

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this survey was not to prove that ESP exists, but merely to gather information from mothers of multiples concerning their multiple's experiences with ESP.

**METHOD:** This survey was completed by mothers of multiples who thought that their multiples had experienced ESP. The sample consisted of 100 surveys.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

1. Dominant twin-types represented were identical girls and identical boys.
2. Seventy-five percent of the ESP episodes involved both twins.
3. Most ESP experiences began before the age of five.
4. One percent only had one ESP episode.
5. Fifty percent had ESP at times of great stress.
6. Most episodes of ESP involve their co-twin and not other family members.
7. In 19% of the families the ESP was experienced with their mother.
8. Fifty percent said that other persons in their immediate and extended families seemed to have ESP.
9. Fifty-four percent of the time ESP was witnessed by persons other than immediate family.
10. Fifty percent of the multiples experiencing ESP had complications at birth.
11. Forty-six percent of the multiples experiencing ESP have been hospitalized overnight at least once since birth.
12. Thirty-three percent of the multiples experiencing ESP have been separated for one to six months.
13. Sixty-five percent of multiples used "twin language" as babies or toddlers.
14. Eighty-eight percent now exhibit similar taste in clothing, toys, hairstyles, etc.

- 15. Twenty percent of the multiples were thought to have exceptionally high IQ's.
- 16. Fifty percent were described by their mom as having a very close relationship.
- 17. Four percent appeared to be frightened by the ESP experience.
- 18. Four percent sought professional help to deal with this experience.

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**CONCLUSION:**

Identical twins experience ESP more than fraternal twins. Many multiples experiencing ESP have had severe illnesses or have be separated for many months. Stress also seems to have a relationship with the ESP incident.
