

Caring about Multiples' Sleep

A Survey Study of Mothers' Care Practices for Triplets & More!

Are you caring for higher order multiple (triplets, quadruplets, etc.) that are less than 12 months old in your home?

We know you are excited about mothering multiples, and we know that caring for three or more infants is different from caring for only one newborn! We are interested in learning what mothers are doing to meet their babies' needs for sleeping and feeding.

This research study is conducted by nurse researchers from Case Western Reserve University. Participating mothers will complete one online survey. Women should be caring for *higher-order multiples* that were born within the last 12 months, and have internet access, be able to read and write English, and be at least 18 years old. Women should not have previously delivered multiple infants (e.g. twins, triplets, or more).
